### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

To recall a play we created in 2014 is like visiting a foreign country. The world is different now. We are different now. We are older, and we have had to weather storms and witness things we never saw coming 8 years ago. Movements, pandemics, awakenings, capitols stormed, wars begun and ended, marriages, deaths, births. We have seen beauties and beasts.

The story feels different. The edges are sharper, the forest is darker. But the magic still sparkles brightly.

As the play has emerged in its new form (every Synetic show asks to be made anew, we can't help it), a theme has emerged. It is fundamental to the original story that Belle learns to see beneath the surface appearance, to see the good in someone who cannot even see his own humanity. What has surprised me is the relevance of how she does it. It is through courage.

It takes courage to stand in front of something frightening and look it in the face. It takes courage to look beneath our first assumptions about people, to weather our fears. It takes courage to cross the threshold, walk into the darkness, and set to work on the debts of our forebears. Love requires courage.

So does art. We did not expect to be doing this play in this moment, but when Paata was in a serious accident in December, we knew that the way Synetic answers a crisis is to make something beautiful. This has been our response. It has taken effort, coordination, late nights, a few mistakes, and a lot of brilliant people to bring this storybook to life. I hope you enjoy setting off into the forest with us, and that it gives you energy to cross your own thresholds, find out what awaits you, and face it with courage and love.

#### **SYNOPSIS**

Emmeranne tells of a prince who fell in love with her in the forest. His parents discovered them and hunted her as a witch, burning the forest along with Emmeranne. But her magic kept her alive. She killed the prince's father and put his castle and under a curse, transforming the prince into a Beast, doomed to live as a monster until the day he finds true love.

In a nearby village, Belle lives a humble life with her father Jean Paul, once a wealthy merchant, and her older sisters, Claudette and Marie, who are smitten with the handsome Avenant, though he is only interested in Belle. One day, Jean Paul learns that one of his missing treasure ships has returned. Delighted, Jean Paul prepares to meet his ship at the harbor, promising his daughters that he will return with anything they desire. Claudette and Marie ask for fine clothes and jewelry. Belle asks only for a single rose.

When he arrives at the harbor, Jean Paul finds his ship empty. Despondent, he wanders into the dark forest and loses his way. He takes shelter in a mysterious castle, where he finds a perfect red rose for Belle. He picks the rose, alerting the lord of the castle—the enraged Beast.

Jean Paul begs the Beast to allow him to go home and bid farewell to his family. The Beast agrees, giving Jean Paul until sunrise to return with the rose. At home, Jean Paul tells his daughters what happened. Belle takes the rose and secretly goes to the castle in his stead.

At the castle, Belle flees to the woods on seeing the Beast. She is attacked by wolves, but the Beast rescues her, bringing Belle back to the castle to recover.

Over time, Belle and the Beast form a close, if unlikely, friendship. His spirit renewed, the Beast excitedly shows Belle the many wonders of the castle. Jean Paul, meanwhile, is distraught at the loss of his daughter and, heartbroken, falls ill.

Determined to keep them apart, Emmeranne shows Belle the Beast's magic mirror, which reveals her father's sickness. The Beast allows Belle to leave with the rose. Unbeknownst to Belle, the rose carries the Beast's heart. When she departs, he starts to die.

Belle returns, restoring Jean Paul with the rose's magic. She tells her sisters and Avenant about the castle. Claudette and Marie persuade Avenant to go to the castle and rob the Beast of his treasures.

Belle finds the Beast's magic mirror. She sees him dying and decides she must return to the castle. As Belle hurries back, Avenant arrives at the castle and attacks the Beast. Belle appears just as Avenant stabs him. She sends Avenant away, then kisses the dying Beast. Having given and received true love, the Beast transforms back into a prince. Defeated, Emmeranne disappears into the forest.




