

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I'd like to welcome you all to Synetic's critically acclaimed wordless production of Shakespeare's 'Romeo and Juliet'. Much has changed in the world and in our lives in the decade-and-a-half since its 2008 premiere, but as with so much of Shakespeare's work, the story's relevance has only grown with the times.

The play's full, official title is 'The Tragedy of Romeo and Juliet', and like all tragedies, the outcome of this one is inevitable. What dictates that outcome are the divisions in Juliet and Romeo's society of war-torn Verona, where rage and street violence are commonplace as their two families—the Montagues and the Capulets—battle each other for... What exactly? It's never specified. They fight simply because they've been fighting, without either side mentioning (or even remembering) the reason. Division, endless conflict, generational hate and misunderstanding, all of it self-perpetuating and ultimately self-defeating—to me, this is the real "tragedy" of Romeo and Juliet. This is the unfortunate timeliness of the play.

At the center of it all, though, we have at least a glimpse of something better—the true, pure love of the title characters. They may not be able to grasp everything they're feeling, or the consequences of their decisions, but for a while at least, they—and we the audience can put the ugliness and violence that surrounds them aside. Their emotions have a truth, universality, and timelessness that transcends the written word, making this story especially adaptable to the visual style for which Synetic has become known for nearly a quarter-century. Here, that visual style is expressed not just through movement, but by setting - a giant clock. Time itself is a character here—an unstoppable one, no matter how fast Romeo, Juliet, or anyone else tries to outrun it. Love and endings — great tragedy is bittersweet. It raises us up and brings us down in the same strike of the clock.

This is also a bittersweet moment for Synetic, as this will be our final production in our Crystal City home. For the foreseeable future, Synetic will be literally "on the move." So I must thank our cast, crew, staff, board, audiences, and donors for making this production, and so many others, possible, and finally we extend our thanks to the entire National Landing community for helping make Synetic such a vital artistic force in the this neighborhood, in Arlington, and in our entire region these past 15 years.



Paata Tsikurishvili (DIRECTOR, FOUNDING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR) A native of the Republic of Georgia, Paata is an innovative, award-winning international artistic director, director, and educator with more than 30 years of experience fusing the classical elements of drama, movement, dance, pantomime, and music. Since Synetic Theater's founding in 2001, Mr. Tsikurishvili has received an impressive 25 Helen Hayes Award Nominations and has won the awards 9-times. Together with his wife and co-founder Irina, he was named "Washingtonian of the Year" in 2013. Mr. Tsikurishvili has directed and performed in Hamlet ... the rest is silence, The Master and Margarita, The Crackpots, Dracula, Host & Guest, Frankenstein, and The Island of Doctor Moreau. He has directed over 60 productions including Salomé, Bohemians, Jason and the Argonauts, The Dybbuk, Faust, Frankenstein, Macbeth, Animal Farm, The Fall of the House of Usher, A Christmas Carol, Romeo and Juliet, Carmen, Dante, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Antony and Cleopatra, Othello, King Arthur, King Lear, Don Quixote, Twelfth Night, Much Ado About Nothing, The Three Musketeers, Alice in Wonderland, The Picture of Dorian Gray, Jekyll & Hyde, The Taming of the Shrew, The Tempest, As You Like It, and The Man in the Iron Mask. In 2016, he moved to Los Angeles where he pursued his MFA in Film and TV production at the University of Southern California's School of Cinematic Arts, where he produced, directed, performed and stunt coordinated on many films. Several of Mr. Cunis' films are heavily influenced by his time at Synetic and have seen festival runs, including the Telluride Horror Show, the Golden State Film Festival, the Macabre Faire Festival, the Knoxville Horror Show, the Jack Oakie Comedy Festival, and the Artemis Women in Action Festival. Upon graduation, Ben was hired to teach directing at USC and was soon promoted to Lead Faculty on the foundational graduate course, Production I. He also co-founded the Virginia-based production company, Granite Kiss Creative, and worked with Lunacy Productions' Stu Pollard to create Trunacy, a non-profit dedicated to helping local indie filmmakers in Kentucky and the Midwest. Originally from Plymouth, New Hampshire, Ben lives with his wife, Betsy Summers, who he met while she was stage managing at Synetic on Lilia Slavova's Nutcracker. They have two children and two cats.
